Re: 2025 Mill & Overlay Resurfacing Program

Dear Resident:

Upper Dublin Township is notifying you that the 2025 Mill & Overlay Program is scheduled to begin on August 4, 2025, weather permitting. Milling will be performed by A. Giuliani of Dresher, PA, and paving will be completed by the Township's Highway Division.

Below is the tentative schedule for the project. Please note that this schedule is subject to change due to weather or equipment availability. We encourage you to visit the Public Works page regularly for the most current updates.

The following streets are scheduled for Mill & Overlay:

Parking Restrictions and Vehicle Access:

Temporary "No Parking" signs will be posted on your street at least three (3) days in advance. While milling or paving may not begin immediately on your street, crews will typically start operations at 7:00 AM. Residents are strongly encouraged to move vehicles out of driveways and off the street before this time.

What to Expect During Milling and Paving:

During milling, when the existing blacktop is removed, residents will generally have access to their driveways with brief notice. However, when milling equipment is directly in front of your property, you may experience delays of 30 minutes or more. Before paving begins, a tack coat (blacktop primer) will be applied to the road surface, and residents should avoid driving on the street until paving is complete. The paving process itself may cause delays of several hours to ensure the new blacktop is properly installed, compacted, and cooled to prevent damage to both the roadway and your vehicle. After paving is finished, please avoid making sharp turns in or out of your driveway for a few days to help reduce the appearance of tire marks on the new surface. This mill and overlay treatment is designed to last approximately 20–30 years, although less intensive resurfacing treatments may be applied every 7–10 years to keep the roads in good condition.

The milling contractor and Township crews will make every effort to minimize disruptions and inconveniences to our residents during this project. We appreciate your patience and cooperation.


